

## NURSE'S AGREEMENT

### NURSE'S AGREEMENT

Agreement between the Town of Swans Island and the Mission, voted on at the Swans Island Town Meeting March 4, 1946, concerning the employment of a Public Health Nurse:

The Town of Swans Island will pay the entire salary of \$1,800. They will also contribute the sum of \$75 for the 1946 dental clinic. The Town also voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50 to help in the payment of off-the-island telephone calls made by the nurse in line of duty and not paid for by the sick person or his family for which calls have been made.

The nurse will charge a fee of fifty cents for a daytime call, \$1.00 for a night call, and \$2.00 for an all-night case. Monies thus received will be turned in to the Town treasury and will go toward paying the nurse's salary.

The Mission guarantees to pay a maximum of \$35 a month car allowance. The nurse will charge fifty cents for use of her car when called out on a case, in addition to the nursing fees referred to above. At the end of each calendar month the nurse will credit the Mission with the total amount thus received toward the use of her car and the Mission will be liable only for the balance to make up a total of \$35.

In consideration of the payment of the bulk of the car expense by the Mission, the nurse will be free to carry on her program of preventive medicine and public health in addition to caring for the sick.
